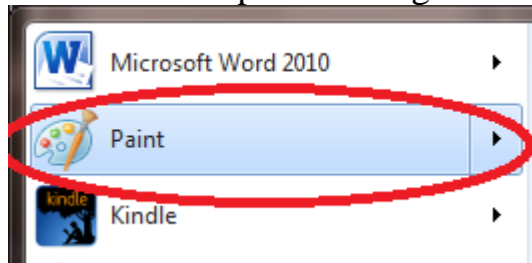



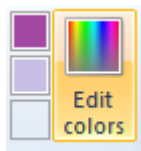
To Figure out the HTML Color Code for a Color on an Existing Image

STEP ONE : Open the image in Microsoft Paint

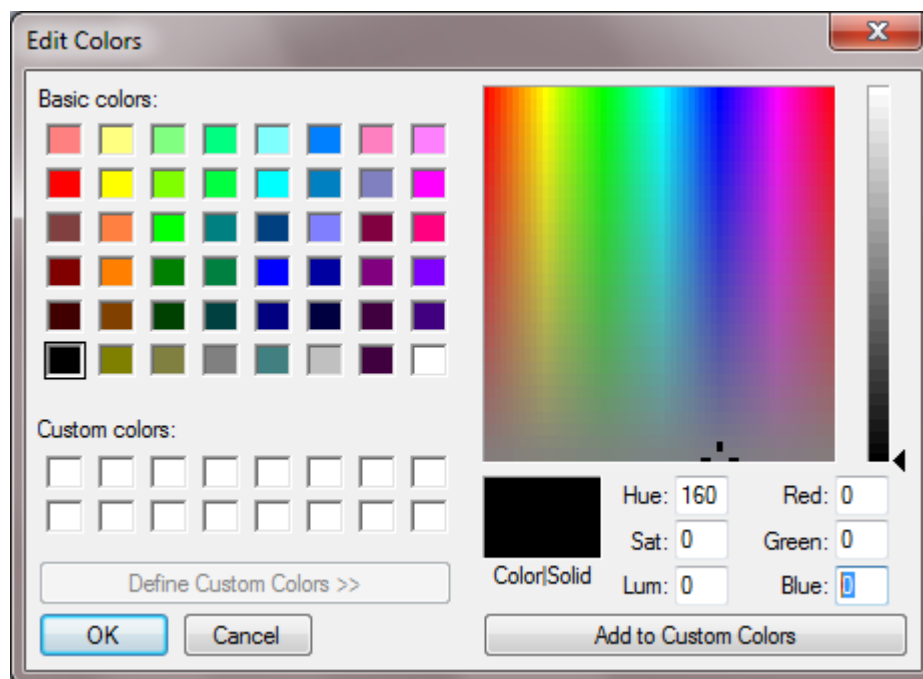


STEP TWO : Click on the Color Picker Icon , and after you select it click on the color in the image you want to use.

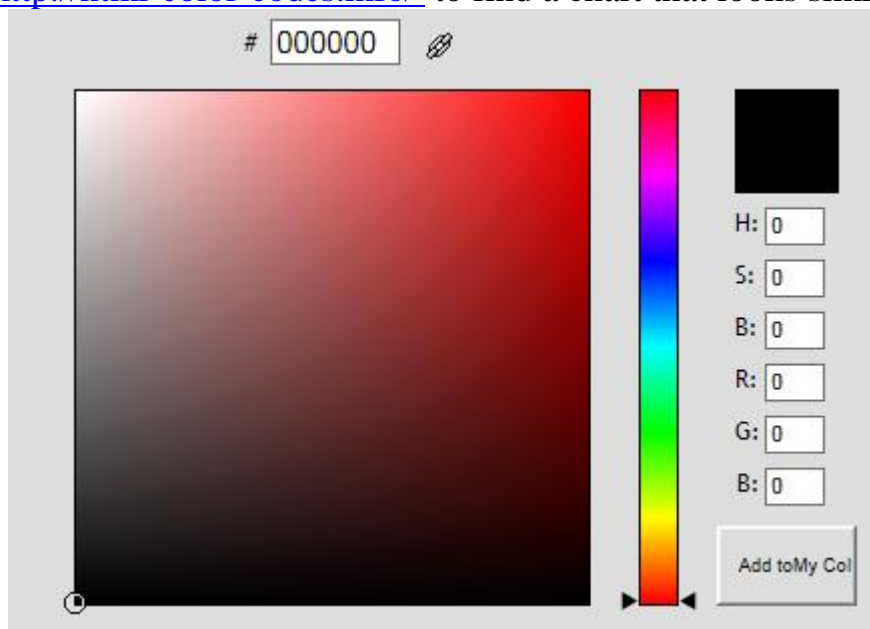
STEP THREE : Once that color is selected, you can find it's RGB numbers by going into the edit colors feature.



STEP FOUR: In the edit colors box that pops up, write down the numbers that are in the Red, Green, and Blue boxes to keep for future use. In the sample below, the numbers in each Red, Green, and blue box is 0 (zero).



STEP FIVE : After you have the red, green, and blue numbers for the color you want, go to an HTML Color picker chart online, like <http://www.colorpicker.com/> or <http://html-color-codes.info/> to find a chart that looks similar to this:



STEP SIX : Enter the R (for red), G (for green), and B (for blue) numbers into the RGB boxes and your 6-character HTML color code will appear in the color code box. In this example with zero in the RGB boxes, the color code is #000000 (black)!
